### Jesus identified with us.

# WALKING BY **HOME GROUP STUDY & DEVOTIONAL**

As you begin, ask the Holy Spirit to teach you and guide your study.

- 1. Read Exodus 32:7-35. Why did God call Israel "your people" and "these people" instead of "my people"?
- 2. In Genesis 12:2, 15:13-21 God promised Abraham that He would destroy the wicked Canaanites and make Abraham into a great nation. What do you think were His motives in making a similar offer to Moses (v. 10)?
- 3. What reasons did Moses give for turning down this offer (vv. 11-13)? What does this tell you about Moses, especially compared to his past concerns when God first called him to lead the people?
- 4. Why was it appropriate that Moses broke the tablets of the Law? What did this action symbolize? For more insight see Exodus 24:3-8.
- 5. Why do you think Moses ground up the idol and made Israel drink it (v. 20)? What was he teaching?
- 6. What "mess" has God rescued you from in your life?
- 7. Do you share Moses' hatred of sin? But do you also share his passionate concern for those in sin's grip? Ask the Lord to instill these in you, and to uproot any tendency to be tolerant of sin or judgmental toward sinners.
- 8. Are you able to so identify and empathize with sinners that you are willing to beg His forgiveness on their behalf? Set aside time this week to intercede in prayer for people you know who are offending against the Lord.

#### FOR DEEPER STUDY

VERSES 11, 31. Moses intercedes on behalf of the people. Intercede means literally "to stand between." Psalm 106:23 describes Moses' actions here as standing "in the breach." The imagery is of standing in a hole in a wall to prevent enemies from entering, or standing astride a chasm, bridging the gap between God and man. What do you learn about intercession from Exodus 32:11-14, 31-32?

**VERSE 14. Relented** does not mean God changed His mind but that He embarked on another course of action. The Hebrew word means "to grieve, to be sorry" (Gen 6:6; 1 Sam 15:29) and describes God's change of approach in dealing with His people (Jer 18:1-12; 19; 26). How does this description encourage your prayer life?

Ephesians 1:11 says that God causes everything to work out the way He wants it to (cf. Rom 8:28). He foreordains what comes to pass, but Scripture doesn't say that He foreordains how everything will come to pass, or when it will come to pass, or by whom it will come to pass. Prayer and evangelism are two of the means that God has ordained, that is, human activity, whereby what He has foreordained comes to pass. In these activities, people become partners with God in bringing His will to happen in the world. Occasionally my wife has called me at work and asked me to pick up a gallon of milk on my way home. When this happened, I took a different route than I would normally take, but I ended up at home nonetheless. Perhaps this is similar to how our praying affects God as He accomplishes His will.

No matter where you are, what you have done, or who you've hurt-whatever the mistake-when you acknowledge that you were wrong, you repent of your sins, and you submit yourself to God, He sets in motion a plan for you to get back on track. This does not necessarily mean that you get back on the path of His original will for you. If God calls you to preach when you are nine years old, but you ignore Him until you are ninety, naturally you will not be able to experience or accomplish all He initially intended for you. However, it doesn't matter if you are nine, nineteen or ninety-nine-your heavenly Father always has a circumstantial plan for you-assignments for you to fulfill on your particular place on the path. He picks up the broken pieces of your life, and with the glue of His love and forgiveness He puts you back together and gives you a wonderful purpose. So you're telling me that the Father can restore and work through anyone? That He can bring joy and meaning back to my life? That He can heal me of all these regrets? Absolutely He can.

- "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life." (John 3:16 NASB) You can use this prayer to express your decision to God:

"Dear God. I know that I am a sinner. I believe that Jesus Christ died on the cross for me and rose from the dead. I trust in Him alone as the only way to get right with You. Thank You for the forgiveness of sins and the eternal life I now have. Amen."
