GODLY SUFFERING & COMFORT

1:3-11

- Paul endured deep, real distress and spoke of it openly and vulnerably.
- As Christians, we share in the sufferings of Jesus. Those hardships are not punishment but indicate our fellowship with Him.
- In all our pain, we have the promise of God's comfort, His sustaining presence and encouragement.
- Suffering provides an opportunity to increase our reliance on God and give us a greater taste of His mercy, exhortation, and power.
- Your sufferings and comfort from Christ are not for you alone; they are meant to be shared with others.

2 Corinthians 11:24-30

Five times I received at the hands of the Jews the forty lashes less one. Three times I was beaten with rods. Once I was stoned. Three times I was shipwrecked; a night and a day I was adrift at sea; on frequent journeys, in danger from rivers, danger from robbers, danger from my own people, danger from Gentiles, danger in the city, danger in the wilderness, danger at sea, danger from false brothers; in toil and hardship, through many a sleepless night, in hunger and thirst, often without food, in cold and exposure.
